

HSHS ST. ELIZABETH'S HOSPITAL OPENS FIRST HUMAN MILK DISPENSARY IN ST. CLAIR COUNTY

HSHS St. Elizabeth's Hospital is excited to share that it is now home to St. Clair County's first milk dispensary, in partnership with Mothers' Milk Bank of the Western Great Lakes (Milk Bank WGL). This joint effort with Milk Bank WGL increases access to lifesaving, critical nutrition for pediatric patients in need.

Located in the Women and Infants Center at HSHS St. Elizabeth's Hospital, 1 St. Elizabeth's Blvd. in O'Fallon, the milk dispensary will act as a hub where families can purchase pasteurized donor milk for short-term emergency use. Breast milk is an essential nutritional therapy that provides numerous benefits, including infection-fighting factors, growth hormones, and improved nutrition and digestion.

"There are several reasons why mothers and caretakers may need our dispensary services," said Amanda Schaefer, MSN, RN, HSHS St. Elizabeth's Women and Infants Center Manager. "They may struggle with low breast milk supply, they may be experiencing an illness or taking a medication that is hindering their ability to breastfeed, or they may have had a child through adoption or surrogacy. We are happy and proud to be the first in our area to provide this service to moms and babies."

"HSHS St. Elizabeth's milk dispensary will provide a valuable service to the community as the first in St. Clair County," said Amber Barnes RN, RNC-NIC, IBCLC, Clinical Manager, Milk Bank WGL. "This will increase the availability of safe, pasteurized donor milk in Southern Illinois. St. Elizabeth's demonstrates its commitment to breastfeeding and best practices by implementing this program. We are excited to partner with them," she said.

Dr. Saba Bajwa, HSHS Medical Group pediatrician, noted, "Babies fed with breast milk have a lower risk of some health issues like obesity, asthma and type 1 diabetes, and they are less likely to have ear infections and stomach bugs. Having this milk bank as a resource will be a great benefit to families with newborns who may need this important nutritional component."

Milk is available for purchase by debit or credit card only in 4 oz. bottles for \$25 each. An online order form and more information about St. Elizabeth's Hospital milk dispensary can be found at steliz.org/milk. MCKENDREE UNIVERSITY'S PARAPROFESSIONAL+ PATHWAY PROGRAM RECEIVES OFFICIAL CERTIFICATION FROM ILLINOIS



McKendree University's new <u>Paraprofessional+ Pathway program</u> has recently gained certification from the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE), making it the very first institution of higher learning in the state to have an approved apprenticeship program for paraprofessionals who hope to become licensed teachers.

McKendree was also the first university in the state to receive the <u>Gateway Apprenticeship</u> <u>Grant</u> through the Illinois Department of Labor (DOL) last fall to support the Paraprofessional+Pathway program. Through this registered apprenticeship program, students may continue working full-time as paraprofessionals while doing their online coursework and practicing skills in the field.

"This collaboration between the Madison County's Gateway Apprenticeship Hub and McKendree University marks a historic milestone as we launch Illinois' first-ever USDOL-approved teacher apprenticeship program," said Becca Ryan, grant manager at Gateway Apprenticeship Hub. "Together, we're forging new pathways to excellence in education, setting a precedent for innovation and opportunity statewide. Madison County Employment and Training Department has been impressed by McKendree's pioneering spirit and commitment to providing equitable pathways into the field of education."

Initially, the Paraprofessional+ Pathway program allowed paraprofessionals to become licensed teachers at the elementary level in only two years. Now, the university has also added a special education track as the program has seen impressive growth and higher demand. Both tracks can be taken completely online with semesters beginning in the summer, fall and spring. Admission requires employment as a paraprofessional, along with approval from administrators.

"At McKendree, we are honored to be the first apprenticeship teacher education program in the state recognized by the Illinois State Board of Education and the Department of Labor. We are excited to bring more options to school districts to help fill the teacher pipeline with quality and successful teachers," said Elizabeth Ketchum, academic advisor and grant administrative coordinator for the School of Education at McKendree.

The School of Education at McKendree University ensures that its students are fully prepared for the teaching career of their choice through a series of real-world experiences and rigorous coursework. Education students benefit from the longstanding relationships the university has with area school districts and are often paired with one of the many McKendree alumni who are now teachers at local K-12 schools. Furthermore, an impressive 98 to 100 percent of McKendree education students who remain in the state of Illinois after graduation land a job in their field of choice.

Tax Credits Every Business Owner Should Know

While tax deductions are great, <u>tax</u> credits can be even better. That's because a tax credit is taken directly against the taxes you owe, as opposed to a deduction, which reduces taxable income. Some tax credits are refundable, which means that if the credit is bigger than what's owed, you get a check back from the government.



If you're running a small business, here are several credits to know about to maximize your savings.

Work Opportunity Tax Credit

If you hire someone that has been unemployed for more than six months, you may be entitled to up to a \$2,400 tax credit; or as much <u>as \$9,600</u> in some cases. You can also receive this tax credit if you hire someone that is:

- Out of the military
- · Coming off welfare
- Out of prison

The Work Opportunity Tax Credit expires at the end of 2025, but for now remains a powerful incentive to hire people from these groups. Before you can claim the credit, the calculation needs to be done in advance using Form 8850. The credit can be applied to either payroll and income taxes owed, depending on your organization. It's not refundable.

Research Tax Credit

Many of my clients think this credit is available only for certain industries, like pharmaceuticals, but that's not the case. The Research Tax Credit can be used by any company that develops new products. I have clients in both manufacturing and distribution that take advantage of it.

This credit has been expanded by the Inflation Reduction Act and can now also be applied against payroll taxes. The credit is usually equal to the sum of 20% of the excess of certain qualified research expenses (wages, supplies, outside contractors, etc.) over a base amount. To claim this non-refundable credit, you need to file Form 6765. The calculation can be complicated. I recommend working with an accounting firm that specializes in it.

Clean Vehicles Tax Credit

The Inflation Reduction Act made a <u>non-refundable credit</u> of up to \$7,500 available to both individuals and businesses when they buy a new, qualified plug-in electric vehicle or fuel cell electric vehicle, assuming you meet certain income qualifications.

What's cool about this credit is that you can get the money back against the purchase price <u>from your dealer</u> at the time of your vehicle purchase.

Paid Family and Medical Leave Tax Credit

Under 1993's Family Medical Leave Act, employers with more than 50 employees must provide unpaid leave and keep jobs open for employees during certain medical and family leave situations. This includes the birth of a child or caring for a close family member.

There's also a tax credit available to encourage employers to pay their employees while on leave. The <u>Paid Family Leave Tax Credit</u> is calculated by taking a percentage of the amount of wages paid to a qualifying employee while on family and medical leave for up to 12 weeks per taxable year. The minimum percentage is 12.5% of wages paid. This increases by 0.25% for each percentage point by which the amount paid to a qualifying employee exceeds 50% of the employee's wages, with a maximum of 25%.

To qualify for this non-refundable credit, an employer must have a written policy that makes this benefit available to all employees. But note, there are some income limitations. Use <u>Form 8894</u> for this credit.

New Retirement Plan Credits

The Secure 2.0 Act created more incentives for employers to offer their workers benefits for retirement savings. Among these are three significant tax credits.

The first is the <u>Retirement Plans Startup Costs Tax Credit</u>. Eligible employers with fewer than 100 employees may be able to claim a tax credit of up to \$5,000 per year, every year for three years, for the ordinary and necessary costs of starting a SEP, SIMPLE IRA or qualified plan, like a 401(k) plan. The expenses include everything related to setting up, administrating and educating your employees about the plan.

If you're eligible, you can also get an additional tax credit of up to \$500 per year for three years for adding an <u>auto-enrollment component</u> to your existing retirement plan (employees can still opt out).

Eligible employers with fewer than 100 employees can also receive a <u>tax credit for matching</u> their employees' retirement plan contributions. For an eligible employer, the credit is a percentage of qualifying employer contributions, up to \$1,000 per employee, made for the first tax year during which the plan becomes effective and the succeeding four tax years.

All of these non-refundable credits can be claimed on Form 8881.
